Hello listeners this is Denis VK6AKR with three items from the WA VHF Group
First off, how did you go in the UHF VHF Field Day a couple of weekends ago? In the metro area at least there were a few of us on air covering 6m through to 23cm from various locations. Thanks for getting on air and I think we will have a good showing for VK6. Mine was a personal best of nearly 1000 points thanks in large part to contacts on 23cm. These were helped by a 27 element loop yagi kindly supplied by Wally VK6KZ.

The longest distance for a 23cm QSO was with Kevin VK6KQ at Keysbrook. With better weather conditions in the Spring Field Day we'll aim to have 3cm gear operating.

If you have not done so already, please submit your logs. They need to be in by tomorrow, Monday 10th at the latest otherwise your and your QSO partners' log entries will not count in the VK6 results. As of this writing there are 11 logs from VK6 operators showing in the WIA log submission web page.

Now I would like to acknowledge the help that club member Dave VK6KV has provided with Ham College. In their June Foundation course, all 8 candidates passed with Dave conducting most of the teaching as well as helping with the practical and on-air components. Well done to those 8 new operators and hope to hear you on air soon.

Thanks Dave for strong support for AR in VK6.

Finally a personal work-in-progress, a frame aerial. Some mature age listeners in particular will be familiar with frame aerials used in early broadcast medium wave band reception. My modern take on this is to use a 5 metre Cat5e computer patch lead supported by the ubiquitous reticulation pipe and fittings. Some PCB-mounted RJ45 sockets, a scrap of perf board and some jumper wires have seven of the 8 "turns" in series aiding, with the 8th "turn" used as the feed to the radio. The Bunnings and Altronics Frame Aerial is born.

So what is the motivation for this contraption? Prof Peter Hall VK6HP from Curtin University's radio astronomy group has repurposed a redundant aviation non directional beacon at Manjimup. He uses the tower, sending and receiving FST4 digital protocols in the 2200 and 630 metre bands with great success. I initially received VK6MJM on a simple 6m squid pole-supported pogostick. Thus encouraged, the frame aerial project was inspired and I hope to report further on this soon.

Thanks for listening and if you're in the Applecross area on a first or third Saturday afternoon why not call in and say hello? You'll be very welcome.

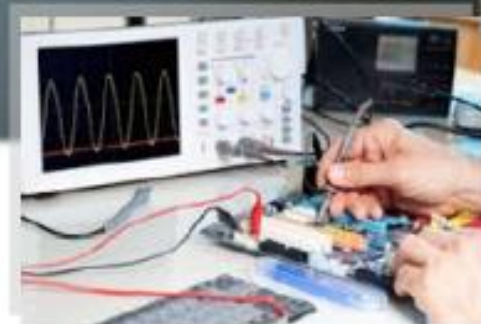
