hello this is Dennis speak six AKR for the WA VHF group incorporated a couple of items for you today reminding you of our launch on Tuesday the 4th of the special event commemorating local radio station 6 WF centenary and the importance of Wally coxen the station's founding engineer I mentioned last week the special event core science VK 106 WF and VK 100 Cox are available for use on a roster basis keep an eye open for a roster

system to appear on the club website and maybe the Facebook page too if you need some materials to use in your presentations please let Robert be K6 WHO or me no and to the second item antenna feed lines it was our intention to transmit on HF as well but those plants were cut short by an obviously faulty feed line on our HF log periodic antenna darkness and some inclement weather prevented a full investigation however on follow up in daylight the cause was determined to be badly corroded connection in the feed line exposure to rain over some 15 plus years had taken its toll replacement connectors cut back cables and a very sound job of weatherproofing with electrical and self amalgamating tape give some hope for a long repair lifetime bonus points the long periodic is not nearly as deaf as we had experienced in the past by strange coincidence Martin the case 6 zims pointed out a YouTube video detailing exactly this sort of repair prior to our announcing the repair in the club mailing list and some others on that new hands vouch for that solution too a final comment in brief several club members showed interest in flowerpot vertical antennas for 10 metre band as had been explained by Andrew VK one ad in amateur radio magazine some years ago mark Vicki 60 and I had already made some using Andrew specifications and Robert VK 6 WHO and Dave VK 6 KV created theirs too when checked with our nano vnas results varied although they were generally acceptable subsequently I build event had ham college saw eight more built with good results being a pedantic old fellow I was keen to achieve better results and so reverted to 1st principles that exercise was cut short for testing with Lenovo and owes more on that next time the embroidery exhibition continues at wireless hill and will prevent us from having full use of the meeting room for normal Saturday activity days O see what is on and where on our Facebook page you will always be welcome so come up and say hello 73 from Dallas speak six AKR for the VHF group incorporated

last week the wireless institute held an online meeting of club presidents to brief them about what they've been up to and to field questions I attended the meeting was informative and congenial disappointingly out of more than 100 amateur radio clubs in Australia just under 30 club presidents or the representatives attended that's not much however one thing stood out it seems a significant number of club presidents had not received the invitation invitations had been sent out by the WA via e-mail it seems to me from resulting e-mail threads that a few factors came into play firstly the WIA relied on emails alone to advertise the meeting emails were addressed to what the WIA understood to be the correct address for each club president no other means of promoting the meeting was employed secondly it could be that e-mail addresses supplied by clubs to the wireless institute were out of date however several clubs advised that their address was correct but that they had not received the emails this points to something broken in whatever method

the wireless institute uses to send bulk emails it's happened before the wireless institute is investigating what happened perhaps those of you who are stalwart Wallace institute of Australia supporters are beginning to bristle thinking this is an attack on the wireless institute well settle pedal it's not and I'll tell you why one of the most difficult things to do when running any organisation is to get the right information to members in a timely manner on the surface it looks easy but income the people the hardest part of running any organisation is the people cut out the people and it would be easy wouldn't it well yes however you'd have no club so here's what I'm getting at communication in an organisation is A2 way thing we have givers of information and receivers of information the givers those distributing information need to understand that people collect and absorb information differently and it's important to utilize more than one means of giving out that information typically these days we see emails social media posts and websites in daily use then there's periodical media such as news broadcasts and magazines now let's take a look at the receivers of this information these people are a much tougher nut to crack but let me firstly say that if you are a receiver of information perhaps a club member or part of a larger and more loosely connected group like us radio amateurs there's a responsibility that lies squarely on your shoulders to listen to to watch to look at and read the sources of information that are available it's not fair for you to say nobody told me you must accept the fact that you won't be receiving a personal invitation to every event meeting gathering etc you have a responsibility to pay some attention to the media used by the senders I hope I'm not appearing to oversimplify the area of communication but really if you're sending out information use a scattergun approach if you as a receiver are even vaguely interested in the world around you you must pay attention to the usual information distribution channels it's pretty easy and I'm Bob Vicki 6 PO

foundations of amateur radio if you've heard the phrase shortwave listeners you might have wondered what on earth that was all about in relates to the length of a radio wave used to transmit information the length of a radio wave is tied to its frequency the longer the wave the lower the frequency when radio amateurs talk about bands like for example the 40 meter band we're talking about a range of frequencies where the wavelength is around 40 meters from a frequency perspective this is around 7 megahertz the 160 meter band at about 1.8 megahertz or 1800 kilohertz is considered the beginning of the shortwave bands this implies that there are longer waves as well if you've ever seen or owned a mid 1980s transistor radio you'll have seen the notation MW which stands for medium wave today it's called the am band older radios might have the notation lwa or longwave the medium wave band is a broadcast radio band that runs between about 500 and 1700 kilohertz the wavelength is between 600 meters and 170 meters when radio was still in its infancy there was also a popular long wave band with wavelengths between 800 metres and 2000 metres or 150 to 375 kilohertz today much of that has gone by the wayside with the advent of digital radio in Australia it's called DAB digital audio broadcasting the whole idea of wave has pretty much vanished some countries like Japan and the United states are in the process of discussing the phasing out of the AM broadcast band much of that

appears to be driven by car manufacturers who claim that the am band is no longer useful or used but forget to tell anyone that they really want to stop having to put AM radios in their cars because it's difficult to isolate the electrical noise from their modern contraptions in order to make it possible to actually listen to that band If you ask me it's a good imaginative to make electronics quiet something which is increasingly important in our wirelessly connected world this might lead you to believe that all activity on air is moving to higher and higher frequencies but that's not the case the properties that made long wave and medium wave radio possible in the early 1900s are still valid today for example there are whisper or weak signal propagation runs on deacons on the 2200m band or at 136 kilohertz whilst your RTL SDR dongle might not quite get down that low most of them start at 500 kilohertz you don't need to spend big to start playing my yasu T-857-D is capable of tuning to 100 kilohertz plenty of space to start listening to the 2200m band even if I cannot physically or legally transmit there if you want to build your own receiver you can check out the weak signals.com website by Alberto Italy to pop our HD where you'll find a project steva cave receiver capable of eight kilohertz to 900 kilohertz using a \$50 circuit board if that's not enough there's radio experimentation happening at even lower frequencies dedicated to listening to anything below 22 kilohertz including natural RF with the wavelength greater than 13 kilometers Renato 1K1QF key runs runs the website VLF dot IT we'll find where you'll find receivers in all tennis to build given that most sound cards operate up to around 192 kilohertz you can start by connecting an antenna to the microphone soundboard of your sound card and use it to receive via area or very low frequencies on your Linux computer you can use quick there are VLF transmitters on air for example saq grammaton radio station in Sweden opened on the 1st of December 1924 capable of 200 kilowatts to submit users about 80 kilometers twice transmits twice a year bonds 2.2 kilohertz we search while we search for higher frequencies frequencies there is still clear if the other we had at the other end of the radios consider consumption for example that the VLF or very low frequency radio waves between 3 and 30 kilohertz can penetrate seawater if you too if you to explore the mono victor K6FLAB
